overview

The 5-day course is designed to introduce participants to the modelling of water flow, solute transport and geochemical reactions within the vadose zone through the application of the modelling software Hydrus 1D and Comsol Multiphysics.

course description

The lessons will be held from Monday to Friday approximately from 9:00 to 15:00. Conceptual and mathematical description of water flow and reactive solute transport processes in the vadose zone will be given during the theoretical sessions of the course. Theory of biodegradation of organic compounds will also be introduced. "Hands-on" computer sessions will provide the participants the opportunity to become familiar with the two modeling software and to translate theory into practice.

It is planned to reserve some time during the last day of the course for a discussion in which the participants introduce and comment open questions related to their own investigation.
